Progress Updates



Scoping review: "Climate Change, Poverty, and Health: A Scoping Review of the Canadian **<u>Context</u>**" published in the Journal of Climate Change and Health.

Rapid Review: "Assessing the Health Impacts of Extreme Heat on Individuals Experiencing Homelessness" submitted to Environmental International.

Commentary: "Addressing Migrants in the National Adaptation Strategies: A Critical **Assessment and Future Pathways**" to be submitted to *Lancet*



Women's Health:

- Finalizing the first draft of a media discourse analysis titled "Women in the Midst: An Intersectionality Study of Canadian Climate Change, Poverty, and Health Media Discourses."
- A systematic review is currently in progress, examining the global impact of exposure to extreme weather events on the health and well-being of women living in poverty, with screening currently underway.



Older Adults:

• A scoping review examining the health impacts of climate change on older adults is currently being planned and initiated.

Children and Youth:

 Developed the research question and search strategy for a scoping review on the effects of climate change on the learning and development of children and youth living in poverty, with a focus on schools.

"Facing Climate Change in Poverty" Research:

• This project is in the recruitment phase, exploring climate-health risks for individuals living in poverty in Canada through expert interviews, including those with lived experience. So far, 21 interviews have been conducted.

Participatory Action Research

- The *Bindian* project documents and shares Indigenous Benguet immigrants' planting practices and uses their traditional dance for community storytelling.
- The Bridging Barriers project fosters dialogue between immigrant youth and policymakers to address housing challenges for African newcomers, using video for community engagement.

Other Initiatives:

• **Curriculum Development**: Developing a course for the public on climate change's health impacts, with a focus on vulnerable populations and resilience strategies.

- **Infographics**: Creating infographics for widespread distribution to policymakers, advocacy groups, and others in the field.
