The Centre for Addiction and Mental Health is recruiting a graduate student trainee to work on a knowledge mobilization initiative that focusses on the intersection between health, poverty and climate change in the Canadian context. This is a paid trainee position involving a time commitment of 1 day/week and starting as soon as feasible. This would be a 1-year contract with opportunities for an extension. The trainee would be expected to have interests and experience in different areas, including knowledge mobilization, climate justice, and health. As this work has Indigenous engagement as a central component (including multiple points of collaboration and partnership to date), Indigenous-identifying applicants are strongly encouraged to apply. More broadly, diversity is a priority in this initiative and, for this role, diverse candidates across multiple domains (e.g., persons from racialized communities) are encouraged to apply as well.
